
#### Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Sept. 14-19, '20.

- Mon 1 Kings 17:17-24 God blessed Elijah and the widow with His limitless resources. That didn't seem to jibe with her son's illness and death, so the mother wanted to know if she was being penalized for former sins. Because the boy's future was more important than her past, Elijah interceded with God, and God restored the boy to his mother, thereby validating her faith. It's a success story all around: giving & receiving forms a golden circle.
- **Tues John 11:1-4, 20-27, 38-44** The key thought is that sickness and death are not ends in themselves, but mechanisms whereby God is glorified. When we are suffering from illness or death of a loved one, we latch onto Jesus, who is powerful enough to overcome death and loving enough to do so for His friends (24-27). Jesus brought everything full circle, which glorified His Father. Those who hid in the shadows missed great opportunity (45-57).
- Wed Romans 12:1-8 What does God receive from us in return for His love? He receives *our reasonable service*—that we *present our bodies as a living* (not a butchered) *sacrifice*, dedicated to Him (1-3). Serving God percolates into serving others (4-5), as each of us stretches our talents, gifts, resources, and skills to make life better for others (6-8). Not too much to ask or give.
- **Thurs Psalm 121** is entitled *A Song of Ascents* because pilgrims sang it when they were walking uphill to Jerusalem. They sang it en route to God's House, depending on God to watch over them day and night as they traversed rough terrain and passed hidden dangers. When the words switch from *my help* to *your keeper*, we are drawn into the holy circle of the LORD's blessings.
- Fri Matthew 16:21-26 Though he was a child of God, Peter was making a big mistake when he objected to God's way of doing His business (21-22), so Jesus set him straight (23). God's way of doing things for the salvation of sinners like us (24-25) stands in contrast to the way humans try to get into heaven or crave becoming important in God's Kingdom. Salvation cost God a lot, and it may cost us a lot to hang onto our salvation, too (26).
- **Sat 1 Corinthians 15:1-11** Our parents, teachers, and pastors have delivered the facts to us (over and over again) that Jesus finished off everything God promised (*according to the Scriptures*) to the world of sinners (3-4). No doubt about these facts for Peter, for the select twelve, for over 500 brethren all at once, for James, for the entire set of apostles, and for Paul himself (5-8), an unfit person if there ever was one (8-10). What does all this mean? It means that God compensates for the total failure of humanity and for the specific failures of individuals, too. We depend on it (1-2,11). Amen and Hallelujah!

SERMON – Acts 3:1-11 Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour.<sup>2</sup> And a man lame from birth was being carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple that is called the Beautiful Gate to ask alms of those entering the temple. <sup>3</sup> Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked to receive alms. <sup>4</sup> And Peter directed his gaze at him, as did John, and said, "Look at us." <sup>5</sup> And he fixed his attention on them, expecting to receive something from them. <sup>6</sup> But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!" <sup>7</sup> And he took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. <sup>8</sup> And leaping up, he stood and began to walk, and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God.<sup>9</sup> And all the people saw him walking and praising God, <sup>10</sup> and recognized him as the one who sat at the Beautiful Gate of the temple, asking for alms. And they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him. <sup>11</sup> While he clung to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astounded, ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's.


## INTROIT

**OLD TESTAMENT READING – Jeremiah 17:13-14** O LORD, the hope of Israel, all who forsake you shall be put to shame; those who turn away from you shall be written in the earth, for they have forsaken the LORD, the fountain of living water. 14 Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved, for you are my praise.

**GOSPEL READING – John 5:1-15** After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.<sup>2</sup> Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Aramaic called Bethesda, which has five roofed colonnades.<sup>3</sup> In these lay a multitude of invalids-- blind, lame, and paralyzed.<sup>5</sup> One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years.<sup>6</sup> When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, he said to him, "Do you

want to be healed?" <sup>7</sup> The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am going another steps down before me." <sup>8</sup> Jesus said to him, "Get up, take up your bed, and walk." <sup>9</sup> And at once the man was healed, and he took up his bed and walked. Now that day was the Sabbath. <sup>10</sup> So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed." <sup>11</sup> But he answered them, "The man who healed me, that man said to me, 'Take up your bed, and walk." <sup>12</sup> They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" <sup>13</sup> Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. <sup>14</sup> Afterward Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse may happen to you." <sup>15</sup> The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him.

#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

#### The Apostles' Creed

The Apostles' Creed is a summary of Christian faith as taught by the Apostles.

- I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
  I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.
