

Board of Trustees (Mr. Tom Lentz, chair) - Year-to-date General Fund offerings are significantly behind expenditures, leaving a deficit of \$32,206. / The ILC Academic Center/North Hall debt has been paid in full, but the ILC Building Fund will remain active and still need donations for possible expansion and other projects. / The board has approved a reduction in mortgage interest rates for the Church Extension Fund (CEF)—lowering the rate on all existing and future mortgages from 4% to 3.5% and will be effective November 1. A new loan of up to \$70,000 was approved for Immanuel of Mankato for the removal and installation of a new gym floor. The floor was recently destroyed by flooding. The Trustee's budget no longer includes debt service as the loan has been paid in full. / Compensation: The proposed FY22 budget includes a salary increase of \$75 per month, plus a 1.6% COLA adjustment of \$42 per month, for a total increase of \$117 per month. This would result in a proposed Tier 1 base salary of \$2,759 (\$3,759 Tier 2). The Board of Trustees is proposing an increase in the standard Retirement Plan contribution of \$10 per month on January 1 of the next two years. / The ILC Planning Committee, is working with an architectural firm in Eau Claire to develop a design concept for the construction of a new gymnasium on the ILC campus. The goal is to have a design ready for review by the April 2021 Coordinating Council, with a final proposal will be presented to the 2021 Convention. /The Trustees. . . have engaged legal counsel to create separate ownership of significant CLC assets, including the campus of ILC, the CEF and possibly other holdings; are working with Alerus to possibly allow congregations to offer their called workers healthcare savings accounts; intend to recommend the establishment of a General Fund endowment to the 2021 Convention; are working to write the CEF guidelines will be written into a single document and present to the next convention for adoption.

FY22 CBP Budget Proposal: Student revenue is down due to the COVID-19 pandemic with fewer total students and fewer students in the dorm. The budget includes convention-directed compensation increases. The budget was presented without any significant cuts.

Missionary Ohlmann has not been able to travel overseas since returning stateside in March. He has been working on the Online Theological Studies (OTS) program and conducting correspondence classes with several individuals. He has preached for Mission Festivals at several congregations and spent three weeks serving the preaching station in Conroe (Houston), Texas. Missionary Evensen continues his work in Togo. He has been using the time away from classes during the pandemic to translate OTS lessons into French and in correspondence with several contacts throughout Africa. Pastor Michael Gurath was unable to travel to Kenya this summer. Pastor John Hein is uncertain about travel plans to Liberia this fall. At our last convention, the Board of Missions was authorized to call a third foreign missionary but the calling process was suspended. The Board plans to bring a proposal for calling a third missionary to the 2021 Convention. Foreign Affiliates: Seminary classes have resumed in Tanzania and D.R. Congo, and visitations have just begun in Nepal, but most of our brethren are still working under very difficult conditions that greatly hinder the usual work of preaching the Gospel. It is our prayer that the LORD would give us all the strength to endure this present situation and enable us to see the new opportunities He lays before us under this current affliction. Finances: The General Fund supports projects and efforts that are ongoing in nature. The Mission Development Fund (MDF) provides funds for projects and efforts that are exploratory or nonrecurring. KINSHIP is used to fund humanitarian efforts which provide support for orphans, Bible school students, and widows. Emergency medical aid and disaster relief also come from this fund.

Immanuel Lutheran College Board of Regents (Pastor John Hein, chair) - Personnel: In July, we welcomed new **Professor Mark Weis**, called to replace retiring professor Paul Sullivan, to his newly remodeled professorage on campus. He began serving as Dean of Students on August 1. / Professor John Reim has announced his plan to retire following the 2020-21 school year, his 33rd year faithfully serving at Immanuel. Our current girls' dorm supervisor, Beth Sandeen, has indicated her desire to conclude her service at the end of the 2020-21 school year. John Fox has resigned from his position as grounds and maintenance worker after four and a half years at Immanuel. We thank the Lord for his service and pray that He blesses all his future endeavors. Brett Lau has been hired as a replacement and will soon begin working full time, Lord willing. / Adjustments to dorm occupancy, class schedules and locations, and cleaning procedures were made. Adjustments to extra-curricular activities were made to comply with state and county regulations, while still attempting to maintain a positive atmosphere by providing activities for the students. Plans for athletics and theater are ongoing, pending state and county regulations. / This summer, our Student Information System was changed to Gradelink. This new system offers a number of additional benefits, including online registration as well as an integrated communication system for distributing texts and emails to parents and students. The online registration, which was implemented this summer, should help reduce administrative workload. / 400 Ingram (Weis) Renovation: With many volunteers involved, including students, much work was accomplished to prepare this home for Prof. Mark Weis. We thank all those who contributed their skills and time for this wonderful labor of love. This includes a kitchen remodel, bathroom updates, cabinetry, siding, windows, flooring, appliances, landscaping, etc. / Security cameras and a new electronic lock system were installed over the summer. The dorms are now locked 24/7, and the other campus buildings are locked most of the time as well. Key fob access has been customized for each individual on campus.

CLC Coordinating Council Summary

September 23, 2020

Board of Doctrine (Pastor Emeritus David Schierenbeck, chair) - The 2018 CLC Convention resolved to seek a final disposition of the 2015 Joint Statement at the 2020 (now 2021) Convention. We will present our report and recommendation on these matters to the Coordinating Council next spring. / We are nearing completion of a review of suggested edits of the Sydow Catechism. / Two former WELS pastors; Luke Willitz, Fairfax, MN and Jonathan Schnose, Dearborn, MI have passed the first stage of the colloquy process. We encourage our pastors and congregations to utilize these men as guest speakers and seek other ways to help acclimate them to our fellowship and ministerium.

Board of Education and Publications (Pastor David Naumann, chair) - As encouraged by the 2018 Convention, the board has begun updating current lessons and adding new lessons to *God's Hand In Our Lives*. Requests are out for willing participants to prepare teachers' notes and student lessons. Volunteers have begun submitting video teaching sessions of the series. / Current and archived *Lutheran Spokesman* articles are available on the website www.LutheranSpokesman.org. In addition, subscriptions to an audio edition of the *Lutheran Spokesman* are available. / The board plans to include electronic donations tabs in discreet locations on our CLC websites.

Board of Missions (Mr. Joel Krafft, chair) - The Committee on Domestic Fields has completed a mission-themed video Bible class study which has been distributed to pastors with the intention of helping congregations consider and discuss different aspects of evangelism. Each of the five presentations includes a thirty-minute video and a fifteen-minute discussion handout with application questions. The videos and handouts are available online: https://tinyurl.com/yxzklnux. / The committee has also completed a "Starting a Preaching Station" checklist, to help those congregations who are thinking about or are in the process of starting a preaching station (https://tinyurl.com/y6kgkgtt).

As with all CLC congregations, our five subsidized mission congregations have been variously affected by the ongoing COVID restrictions. *Living Savior* (Appleton, WI) has resumed services with worship on Sunday and Wednesday to spread out worshipers. Several instruction classes are in progress. *Zion* (Atlanta, GA) recently celebrated the confirmation of two young members. Pastor Gantt has resumed the circuit of visiting members in nearby states who are served by Zion. *Mt. Zion* (Detroit, MI) produced a "virtual VBS" this summer with volunteers from the congregation. They have resumed Sunday worship services and continue to conduct monthly services at a preaching station in Cleveland, Ohio. *Gift of God* (Mapleton, ND) has six young people in Catechism instruction, four of whom are from non-member families. Pastor Del Maas has accepted a call to serve also *St. Paul*, Ponsford, MN. *Ascension* (Tacoma, WA) has just recently resumed services and hopes to resume preaching station services in Oregon soon as well.

Mon Ezekiel 18:1-4,25-32 One's sin-guilt cannot be dumped on someone else in the family (à la the proverb), and here God set the record straight (3-4). The *fair* way to deal with sinners is to hold each accountable for his own sins, repent of them (*get a new heart and a new spirit*), and escape punishment. God doesn't want anyone to go to hell, and neither do we.

Tues Matthew 21:28-32 This parable/story illustrates how repentance works. Both boys sinned against their father; the first with a rebellious retort, the second by lying. The first regretted his sin and reformed; the second did not regret his lie and did not reform. Same story with many others who faced off with Jesus (31-32). Lord, have mercy on us!

Wed Philippians 2:1-11 In our family and in our congregation, we bond with one another (1-2) by putting our personal interests second to the interests of others (3-4). We live in the shadow of our Savior, who put Himself second to the entire human race in order to square everyone with God (5-8). When He had finished that job, He earned the highest exaltation (9); sooner or later everyone will have to admit His lordship and bow before Him (10-11).

Thurs Psalm 25 has a background: David adulterated, cheated, lied, and murdered, but God had not given up on him (2 Samuel 11). Next, God sent Nathan to confront him, and David repented (2 Samuel 12). That was not the end of his troubles, for his son Absalom turned traitor, and forced David to flee for his life. That's the background; now let's read the psalm again.

Fri Luke 22:61-62 Peter put up a tough front to keep others at a safe distance but he couldn't bear to cold-shoulder Jesus. Why not? Because he felt the love of Jesus drawing him close. That's what brings a wayward child of God back from the brink (doesn't it?) to a tearful reunion with the Son of God, who loves us . . . all the way through His earthly life and into heaven.

Sat Acts 17:16-21 Paul didn't sit on his hands in the capitol city, but visited the local synagogue and interfaced with Jews and Gentiles alike, explaining what God had done for humanity. Of course, that meant he presented Jesus' death and resurrection. [In Greek, the word *Anastasis* (resurrection) sounded sorta like the name Anastasia, and that might mean a new goddess.] Greeks were not only polytheist idolaters, but great thinkers and conversationalists, too, so God took advantage of their human traits as access for Paul and the Holy Spirit to get onto the inside track with them.
