Reading of the Obituary

William H. Hartmann (Bill) was born on September 3, 1949 to James Edwin Hartmann and Corinne Louisa Fischer in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He was baptized into the Christian faith at Atonement Lutheran Church, and later confirmed in the faith at that same church in 1963. Bill received his elementary and secondary education in Milwaukee, WI, went on to receive a degree from the University of Wisconsin, and subsequently graduated from the Lutheran Seminary in Mequon, WI.

(Ps. 139:1ff) Bill married Elizabeth (Liz) Gehrau at Woodlawn Lutheran Church on February 28, 1970. Bill is survived by his wife Liz, father James Hartmann, children Dana (Paul) Peterson, Kristine (Joel) Gerbitz, Timothy (Elaine) Hartmann, Kurt Hartmann, Kathryn (Joe) Gallo, twenty-one grandchildren, 2 great-grandchildren, and 3 brothers. He was preceded in death by his mother Corinne Hartmann.
