


Distribution



Midweek Lenten Worship: Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. We will have midweek worship services throughout the Lenten season on Wednesdays at 2:00 pm. These services prepare us to consider our identity and connection with the Passion of Christ as the baptized children of God. We do so through the eyes of the Holy Evangelist, Saint John, as we hear, in John 18–19, of Jesus' betrayal and arrest, Jesus facing Annas and Caiaphas, Jesus before Pilate, Jesus delivered, Jesus crucified, and Jesus' death and burial. Look for this Lenten season to provide a deeper understanding of your Baptism into the passion and death of Christ, with the result as Paul describes it: we are "always carrying about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body." (2 Corinthians 4:10).

ILC Tour Choir Concert: The ILC Tour Choir is scheduled to be here for a concert on Tuesday, March 12th @ 7:00 pm.

ILC Tour Choir: For many years the ILC Tour Choir has been granted a special rate for using a charter bus during their yearly tour in holding concerts at various CLC congregations. This year that rate is being discontinued. After comparing the cost of using various bus companies, the common rate would be approximately \$11,000 higher than expected for budgetary reasons. Normally an offering is collected during the tour which will still happen. But this year CLC President Michael Wilke is authorizing this synod-wide announcement to allow others to share in their support of the Tour Choir. This offering would help offset the extra expense needed for the bus. Therefore, if members of CLC congregations wish to support this, please designate your offering to & "ILC Tour Choir."

ILC Dorm Supervisors: After serving as dorm supervisors, both Paul and Courtney Agenten plan on resigning at the end of this academic year. We thank them both for their faithful service to the LORD and for being such positive role models to our dorm students. ILC is accepting applicants for these two positions to begin the 2024-25 year, an adult male for the boys' dorm and an adult female for the girls' dorm. These roles are vital to our campus given how they provide spiritual counsel and a fatherly or motherly role to those students who are living away from home. 🕂 Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions 🕂

February 5 - February 10

Monday: John 6:26-35 – Jesus is the Bread of Life, and His miraculous feeding of the thousands in the wilderness was a sign of the greater feeding that He does by His forgiving word. That feeding brings life eternal!

Tuesday – **1 John 4:7-17** – God is love. He showed that love by sending His own Son (the Son of God) into the world that we may live through Him. We reflect His love by loving one another and confessing that Jesus is the Son of God, thus sharing the Bread of Life.

Wednesday: Jeremiah 18:1-10 – The Lord of the nations has the right to deal with the nations as a potter would deal with the clay in his hands, and He has the mercy to forgive those who repent and relent from sending the promised disaster.

Thursday: Matthew 17:1-9 – Jesus is facing suffering and death to bring us life (16:21) and receives the support of Old Testament believers Moses and Elijah (verse 3). The voice of the Father declares Him to be the beloved Son, to be revealed when and how He wishes (verse 9).

Friday: 2 Peter 1:16-21 – After the resurrection, Peter remembers how Jesus received honor and glory from God the Father on the mountain of Transfiguration. This glory is also given to Jesus in the Scriptures, like a lamp shining in a dark place.

Saturday: Isaiah 25:1-9 – The Lord's name is to be praised! His might is greater than the fortified city of His enemies (verses 1-5), and His mercy provides a banquet for the poorest of His own people (verses 6-9). "Let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation!" (verse 9)
