
Confession and Absolution



Gospel Reading

Mark 6:45-56

⁴⁵ Immediately He made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, to Bethsaida, while He sent the multitude away. ⁴⁶ And when He had sent them away, He departed to the mountain to pray. ⁴⁷ Now when evening came, the boat was in the middle of the sea; and He was alone on the land. ⁴⁸ Then He saw them straining at rowing, for the wind was against them. Now about the fourth watch of the night He came to them, walking on

the sea, and would have passed them by. ⁴⁹ And when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed it was a ghost, and cried out; ⁵⁰ for they all saw Him and were troubled. But immediately He talked with them and said to them, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." ⁵¹ Then He went up into the boat to them, and the wind ceased. And they were greatly amazed in themselves beyond measure, and marveled. ⁵² For they had not understood about the loaves, because their heart was hardened. ⁵³ When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret and anchored there. ⁵⁴ And when they came out of the boat, immediately the people recognized Him, ⁵⁵ ran through that whole surrounding region, and began to carry about on beds those who were sick to wherever they heard He was. ⁵⁶ Wherever He entered, into villages, cities, or the country, they laid the sick in the marketplaces, and begged Him that they might just touch the hem of His garment. And as many as touched Him were made well.

Sermon Text Genesis 9:8-17





II. The Rainbow Connection





∔ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions **∔**

July 29 – August 3

Monday: Matthew 14:22-34 — Not even stormy waves or contrary winds can keep the Lord Jesus from coming to His disciples in their time of need. He will patiently rescue even one of little faith.

Tuesday: Acts 24:22-26 – Although Felix did not have the best reasons for sending for Paul (hoping Paul would give him money, verse 26), it gave Paul opportunities to speak about things Felix needed to hear before the coming judgment.

Wednesday: Exodus 17:1-7 — The Lord has been feeding His people miraculously with manna and quail, but when there is no water, they do not look to Him, but quarrel with Him, testing Him. Still His patience is so great that He supplies water from a rock for them.

Thursday: Romans 13:8-10 – The sum of all the commandments is: love. Love God. Love neighbor. God has already shown His love toward us in Christ Jesus. When we show love to our neighbor we are showing them how God feels about them.

Friday: 2 Timothy 1:7-10 - A spirit of power and love and sound judgment is a great gift from God. Even when we suffer for the Gospel, we can rely on the power of God, who revealed immortality through the Gospel.

Saturday: John 6:66-69 – Jesus would walk through a storm on Galilee to be with His disciples (Matthew 14). Many of his disciples, however, turned away from Him. But Peter speaks for the Twelve: recognizing immortality in His words inspires their continued following of Him.
